

Nature Trails

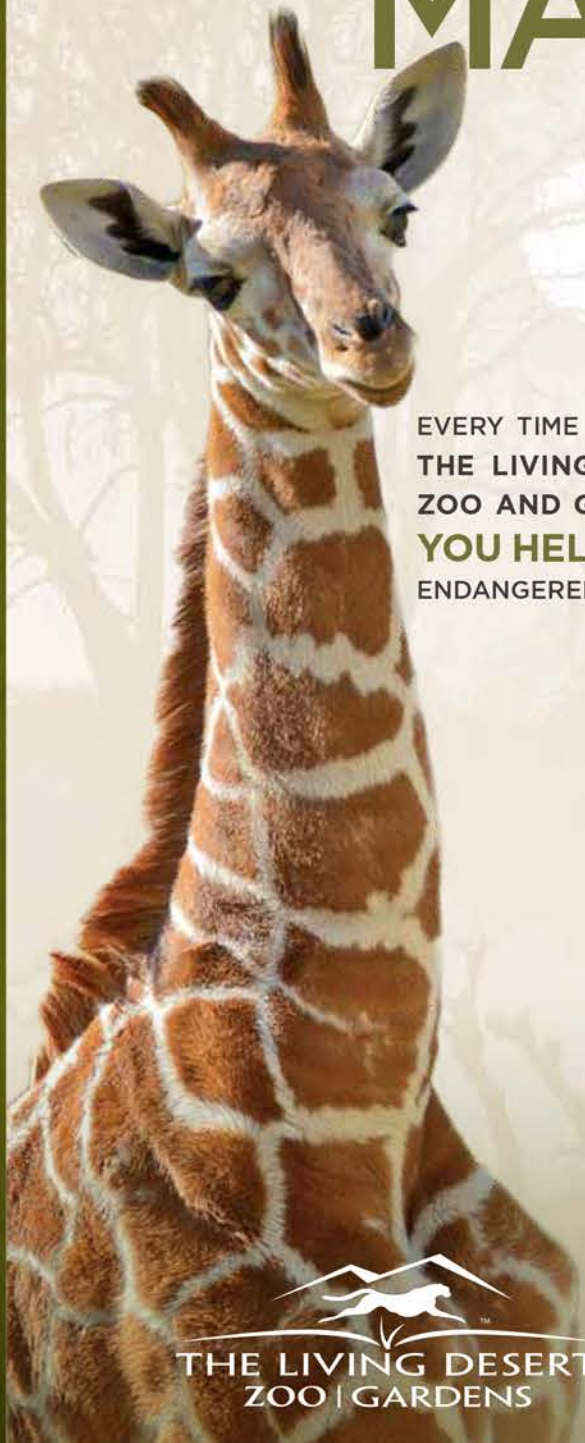


The Living Desert is more than a collection of exhibits. It is also a nature preserve, protecting over 1,000 acres of Sonoran desert. Within the preserve, there are a series of nature trails of varying degree of difficulty.

From a casual stroll on open flat ground, to a moderately strenuous hike through a boulder field and trail to the base of Eisenhower mountain, these trails offer majestic views and bring you closer to nature.

The nature trails are closed during the summer. Please ask for more detailed information including entry and exit times at Admissions.

GUEST SERVICES

- Shuttle:** The shuttle runs every 15 minutes and has 11 stops throughout the park. Tickets may be purchased from Admissions or any shuttle driver.
- Dining:** There are a variety of guest dining options available.
- First Aid:** Available at the Welcome Center, Discovery Center, Tenny Wildlife Hospital and Village WaTuTu.
- Nursing Lounge:** Quiet place for moms to care for and breastfeed their babies in privacy.

- Carousel:** Hitch a ride on the Tenny Endangered Species Carousel – a magical way to learn about the desert's fascinating animals.*
- Hike:** Select one of our three trails to suit your desired experience of the real, undisturbed Sonoran Desert.*
